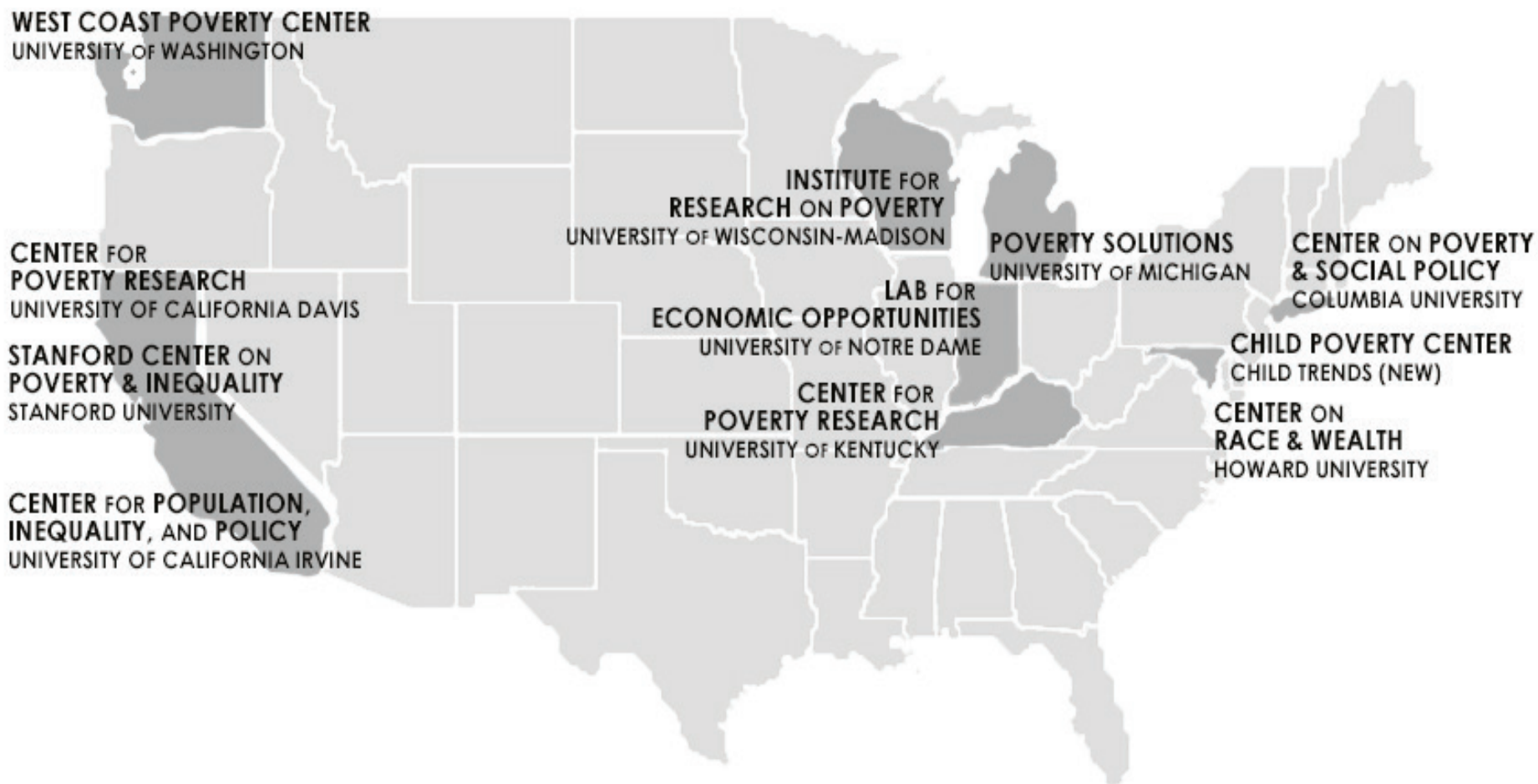

 2. Show a demonstrated interest in poverty research
- and
3. Either:
 - a. Be at a [Non-R1 university](#)
 - or
 - b. Meet the [NIH definition of underrepresented](#) in their field of study

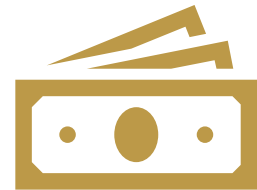

Application

- Complete **online Application Form**
- Upload as 1 pdf:
 - 2-page letter
 - describe poverty research interests and experiences
 - Specifies the status of your graduate degree
 - CV
 - Transcripts
