National Poverty Fellow Program

- Fellowship created in 2014
- Fellows are UW-Madison Employees
- Work at
 - ASPE Office of the Assistant Secretary for Planning and Evaluation

Within the Administration for Children and Families

- OPRE Office of Planning, Research and Evaluation
- OCS Office of Community Services



Fellowship Elements

- Fellowships are for one year
- 20% of the fellows' time is allotted to their own poverty- or inequality-related research
- Two mentors: Academic research mentor and a policy mentor
- \$3,000 professional development budget
- 2 visits to IRP and participate in IRP's <u>virtual professional development</u> training series.

Eligibility and Salary

- US citizens who are up to 6 years post-Ph.D.
- substantive background in poverty, economic inequality, and social policy
- strong research skills
- excellent communication skills
- work well as part of a team
- pass a federal security background check
- Compensation is around \$95,000 per y



Application Process

- Submit an intent to apply
- 3 academic reference letter writers
 - References must submit letters directly
- Complete the application form:
 - Statement of interest
 - Detail your interest, background and qualifications
 - Current CV
 - Relevant research/writing sample



Selection Process and Timeline

- November 27, 2023 by 11:59 p.m. CT
 - Application and reference letters due
- December 2023 mid January 2024
 - IRP affiliates rate materials
 - Marah completes informational interviews with top candidates
- Late January to mid February
 - Top candidates sent to HHS
 - HHS completes interviews
