

- 4 scholars selected to visit a Poverty Center in the 2024-2025 academic year
- Funding covers:
 - Transportation
 - Lodging
 - Meals

LOGISTICS OF THE APPLICATION PROCESS Application

- Complete <u>online Application Form</u>
- Upload as 1 pdf:
 - 2-page letter
 - describe poverty research interests and experiences
 - Indicate the CPC institutions that you are applying to (up to 3, ranked by preference)
 - -CV
 - 2 examples of poverty-related written materials

LOGISTICS OF THE APPLICATION PROCESS Timeline

- April 3, 2024: Deadline for proposal receipt
- Mid-May 2024: Notification of award
- 2024-2025 Academic Year:
 Dates for Visit (flexible)
