- 1. Be enrolled in a Ph.D. or master's degree program in the 2024-2025 academic year at a US university
- 2. Show a demonstrated interest in poverty research

and

- 3. Either:
  - a. Be at a Non-R1 university

or

b. Meet the <u>NIH definition of</u> <u>underrepresented</u> in their field of study

    - Specifies the status of your graduate degree
  - -CV
  - Transcripts
